IMPORTANT

1. Although tempting, it is better not to spray your blackberries prior to flowering. They are still growing and therefore will continue to produce leaves. By spraying now you might see an immediate response, however the plant will regenerate.

If you don't and a fire starts then you are liable for the fire, you will face a fine and you may compromise your insurance.



Seymour Ag Seasonal Thoughts

Pastures

It has been a great season for producing hay. Ryegrass based pastures have been great this year and in my case the clover has 9done really well – although I have been told that this hasn't been a year for clover up north!

It is now time to look at the pasture content. You need to ask yourself several questions- is it full of capeweed, erodium, silver grass, or some of the other more undesirable weeds? Is it looking as good as it should? Is the aim to have a clover based pasture or grass? This should help to decide what you would need to do next autumn. Attacking weeds earlier is cheaper and more effective. If there is not enough good plants there then we need to plan to boost the plant content. The best way to control weeds is competition with desirable plant species.



Hay Season

We have sourced a great range of inoculants for both silage and hay. I know it is getting a bit late for silage, but it is still a good idea for hay baling. What it enables you to do is to bale hay earlier. If you normally bale at 15% moisture – this will allow you to bale at 22%. Great for when there is a rain coming and panic is setting in. We have used some with great success so come in and find out more!



Lice and Flies

The last of the Diazinon that we could use in the form of Eureka Gold has been taken off the market. It was a messy way to control lice. What I would suggest is to use a cage-dipping contractor – or use your own dip with Assassin plus Vetrazin for flies. Additionally, we have good supplies of Extinosad, Assassin and Avenge for any lice issues that you may have. There is a new compound coming but it still is 12 months off. For just flies, the old favourites are still available but now there is also Clikzin, which has a lower concentration of the Clik active ingredient so that you can sell your sheep earlier.

We have a great supply of wool packs and shearing gear. We were able to get hold of some well-priced wool packs – which we got prior to the latest price rise.

Some Short Notes:

Fire Ready: It is time to look at your preparation for the fire season. As mentioned earlier we have been able to source a Yamaha pump from one of our NRI stores. They have sold 30+ last year without any issues. These are very well priced. We also have a good supply of water/air extinguishers and other requirements. These all meet Australian standards and are certified.

Eweguard: We sometimes forget that the rams also need a booster of 6 in 1 prior to the coming season. One great way is to use Eweguard, which also gives them a Cydectin drench at the same time so you get the best of both worlds. It is also the best time to give them a lift with the use of Multimin.
